Meat Free Mondays.....will you join us?

It's the easiest way to help save our world

What would happen if 60 of us had one meat free day per week for a year?

- We would save the equivalent amount of greenhouse gases as driving from London to Edinburgh
- 114.73 people would be fed . Animal agriculture uses about a quarter of the world's grain - so we would be lowering the price of grain and the poorest people would find it easier to feed themselves
 - 178.71 tennis courts of forest would be saved
